# **ARIN 2017-10: Repeal Of Immediate Need for IPv4**

# ARIN 2017-10: Problem Statement



- Since the IPv4 free pool has been exhausted ARIN has been unable to provide addresses via this section, since ARIN cannot fulfill a request within 30 days
- This issue was noted in the ARIN 40 Policy Experience Report
- The continued presences of this section is misleading and confusing

# ARIN 2017-10: Changes to Current Policy Text

- Section 4.2.1.6 of the NRPM is hereby repealed and section number 4.2.1.6 is hereby retired.
- Section 4.3.4 - Remove phrase "Immediate need [4.2.1.6] or"
- Section 4.5, Item 7 - Remove phrase "unless the organization can demonstrate additional need using the immediate need criteria (4.2.1.6)"

# ARIN 2017-10: Resulting Policy Text

- **4.2.1.6. Immediate need**

If an ISP has an immediate need for address space, and can provide justification to show that the address space will be utilized within 30 days of the request, ARIN may issue a block of address space, not larger than a /16 nor smaller than ARIN's customary minimum allocation, to that organization. These cases are exceptional.

# ARIN 2017-10: Resulting Policy Text

- **4.3.4. Additional considerations**

End-users may qualify for address space under other policies such as ~~Immediate need [4.2.1.6]~~ or Micro-allocation [4.4].

- **4.5.7. Multiple Discrete Networks**

Upon verification that the organization has shown evidence of deployment of the new discrete network site, the new network(s) shall be allocated the minimum allocation size under section 4.2.1.5 ~~unless the organization can demonstrate additional need using the immediate need criteria (4.2.1.6).~~
