• AFPUB-2017-DNS-001-DRAFT-02: Lame delegations in AFRINIC reverse DNS

- Outlines monitoring/reporting/removal procedures for lame .arpa domain objects found in the AFRINIC database
- If lame and unresponsive, the nameserver attribute is removed, and remarks are added to the object
- If all nameserver records are lame for a given delegation, the domain object would be removed in its entirety (historical information about removed domain objects to be archived)
- Ratified 28 March
- Pending implementation





• 2017-GEN-002: AFRINIC Policy Development Process Bis

• PDP rewrite, focuses on Chair/VC powers/decisions, detaching authors from proposals

2017-V4-002: Route Aggregation Policy

• Has AFRINIC issue IPv4 prefixes as aggregates when multiple additional IPv4 allocations are requested

 2016-GEN-001: Internet Number Resources review by AFRINIC

• Empowers AFRINIC to conduct regular audits on members and allow recovery of resources that fail such an audit





• 2016-V4-001: IPv4 Soft Landing BIS

- Replacement of current IPv4 soft landing policy
- Sets max allocation size to /18
- Limits (max) allocation frequency to once every 2 years
- Reserves a /12 to facilitate IPv6 deployment.

prop-118: - No need policy in APNIC region

- Simplify transfer of IPv4 space between resource holders. Ease some administration on APNIC staff
- Consensus reached at APNIC 45 to change author

prop-119: - Temporary transfers

- Allows temporary transfers that would allow organisations to have resources directly registered under them while they are the custodians of these resources on the Internet.
- Consensus reached at APNIC 45 to change author

• prop-123: - Modify 103/8 IPv4 transfer policy

- Allow the transfer of 103/8 addresses without the 5-year restriction for delegations made before 14 September 2017.
- Returned to the author for further consideration and to submit a revised proposal as per community feedback.

prop-120: - Final /8 pool exhaustion plan

- This proposal provides guidance for 103/8 pool exhaustion.
- Under discussion on the Policy Special Interest Group (SIG) mailing list

prop-124: - Clarification on IPv6 Sub-Assignments

- Clarifies the definition of assigned address space for IPv6 delegations under section 2.2.3 of APNIC Internet Number Resource Policies document.
- New proposal





- LAC-2018-1: Proposal to create a Global Internet Registry (GIR)
 - Proposes a virtual RIR for assigning IP addresses and Autonomous System Numbers to organizations without a single regionalization
- LAC-2018-2: Update the policy on transfers due to mergers/acquisitions
 - Adds legacy resource and transfer lock period language to Merger/Acquisition transfer policy that exists in other transfer policy
- LAC-2018-3: IP-Based Geolocation
 - Directs LACNIC to post a public file with assignments/subassignments and country info





• LAC-2018-4: Review and correction of errors in the IPv6 policy

• Clarification and reference updates in IPv6 policy

- LAC-2018-5: Registration and validation of "abuse-c" and "abuse-mailbox"
 - Mandates an abuse contact/mailbox for resources allocated by LACNIC

• LAC-2018-6: Simplification of the PDP

• Allows consensus to be achieved outside of public forum





• LAC-2018-7: Clarification of IPv6 Sub-Assignments

 Adds language surrounding temporary address or /64 provisions for Bring Your Own Device networks, hotspots, Virtual Private Networks, etc.

New Proposals (29 March)

- LAC-2018-8: Update to the Policy on IPv4 Assignments to End Users
- LAC-2018-9: Update to the Policy on Initial IPv4 Allocations to ISPs
- LAC-2018-10: Simplifying the PDP (Mailing List + Forum Option)





2017-02: Regular abuse-c Validation

- Directs RIPE NCC to validate abuse contacts annually and follow up in cases where contact information is invalid
- Comment/review period ended 10 April

• 2018-01: Organisation-LIR Clarification in IPv6 Policy

- Aims to clarify "organisation" and "LIR" usage, and align IPv6 and IPv4 allocation policy
- Under discussion, impact analysis underway
