IPv4/IPv6 IX Micro-allocations




RWhois Requirements



3.2. Distributed Information Server Use Requirements

• The distributed information service <u>must be</u> <u>operational 24 hours a day, 7 days a week</u> to both the general public and ARIN staff. The service is allowed reasonable downtime for server maintenance according to generally accepted community standards.



RWhois Requirements



Historically, getting more IPv4 addresses was the enforcement method

Policy does not specify any enforcement mechanism for not meeting the uptime requirement

Several enforcement mechanism have been proposed

Waiting List




In the event that ARIN does not have a contiguous block of addresses of sufficient size to fulfill a qualified request, the organization will be provided the option to be placed on a waiting list of prequalified recipients, listing both the block size qualified for and the smallest block size acceptable.

The position of each qualified request on the waiting list will be determined by the date it was approved. Each organization may have one approved request on the waiting list at a time.

As address blocks become available for allocation, ARIN will fulfill requests on a first-approved basis, subject to the size of each available address block and a timely re-validation of the original request. Requests will not be partially filled. Any requests met through a transfer will be considered fulfilled and removed from the waiting list.
